### YES

Newspapers/Inserts

Magazines

Catalogs

PAPER

**Junk Mail** - no product samples like credit cards, etc.

Envelopes - labels/window okay

Home Office Paper - white/pastel paper, copy/fax paper, post-it notes, manila envelopes, shredded file folders, paper ream wrappers



Wax Coated Papers/Boxes - juice/milk boxes

NO

**Tissues/Tissue Papers** 

**Food Wrappings** 

**Paper Towels** 

Soiled/Food-Stained Paper

**Boxboard** - thin cardboard like cereal boxes, shoes boxes, soda/beer cartons

**Hard Back Book Bindings** 



## YES

Aluminum Cans Steel/Tin Cans

**Glass Bottles -** beer, wine, food jars (remove all caps, corks, and lids)



#### Did you know?

Glass bottles and jars can be recycled endlessly without any loss in purity or quality.



### NO

Bottle Caps
Aerosol Cans
Paint/Solvent Containers



#### Did you know?

Recycling one aluminum can save enough energy to light a 100 watt light bulb for four hours.



CARDBOARD

#### YES

**Plastic Bags** - place all bags in one and tie closed

**Plastic Bottles** - only "twist-on" bottles are acceptable, such as:

Milk Jugs

Pop / Water / Juice Bottles Laundry Detergent Bottles Shampoo Bottles All-purpose Cleaner Bottles



#### NO

**Plastic Caps / Lids** - please remove caps/lids and discard

**Tubs or buckets** - butter, wash buckets, trays, clamshells, etc.

Ziplock bags Black plastic bags



#### Did you know?

Americans use 2.5 million plastic bottles every hour! Most of them are thrown away.

Brown Cardboard / Thin Brown
Boxboard - soda box, clean pizza box
Moving / Mailing Boxes
Cardboard Egg Cartons



#### NO

Grey or White Cardboard or Boxboard

Waxed Cardboard or Boxboard



#### Did you know?

Cardboard is the single largest component of municipal solid waste around the world. Recycling one ton of cardboard saves nine cubic yards of landfill space and 380 gallons of oil.

Since its beginnings, Earth First Aid has recycled roughly **900 tons** of paper. Every ton of paper recycled saves 3.06 cubic yards of landfill space, 7,000 gallons of water, and 4,000 kilowatt hours of energy.
